### THE INTERPRETATION ORDINANCE

(Chapter 5)

UNDER SECTION 39 OF THE INTERPRETATION ORDINANCE CHAPTER 5, THE POWERS SPECIFIED IN THE FIRST COLUMN CONFERRED BY THE ORDINANCE MENTIONED IN THE SECOND COLUMN HAVE BEEN DELEGATED BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR TO THE OFFICER MENTIONED IN THE THIRD COLUMN.
