THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT

(Chapter 98:04)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON ME BY SECTION 3 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

Citation 1. This Order may be cited as the Wages Council (Rice Factory Workers) Order 1977.

Interpretation 2. In this Order —

"rice factory" means any premises in which padi is manufactured into rice by mechanical power, and includes any place, building, machinery, or equipment, used in connection with or in relation to such premises for the storage of padi or rice or the manufacture of rice.

Establishment of Wages Council.

- 3. There is hereby established in respect of workers to whom this Order applies and their employers, a Wages Council to be known as a Wage Council for Workers in Rice Factories.
- Application 4. This Order applies to all workers employed by any person wholly or mainly in any of the following capacities in or about any work in connection with the operations of a rice factory:—
 - (a) labourer;
 - (b) concrete attendant;
 - (c) huller attendant;
 - (d) porter;
 - (e) fireman;
 - (f) mechanic; and
 - (g) bookkeeper.
