BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly approve of the write-off against the outstanding loans made by the Government to the Guyana Credit Corporation totalling fourteen million, seven hundred and fifty eight thousand, nine hundred and eighty-seven dollars and sixty-two cents (\$14,758,987.62), of the sum of three million, one hundred and seventy-three thousand, six hundred and seventy-two dollars and sixty-seven cents (\$3,173,672.67) representing bad debts written-off by the Corporation on 30th June, 1966, as summarised in the undermentioned schedule, together with the interest that has accrued thereon to date.
