- 1. The ittorney General to move the first reading of the following Bill:-
 - A BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR ANNUAL HOLIDAYS WITH FAY FOR WORKERS IN CERTAIN OCCUPATIONS.

2. Dr. Nicholson to move the following motion:-

That, this Council accepts in principle the proposed Federation of the British Caribbean Colonies and agrees to consider in a Committee of all the unofficial members of the Council the recommendations in the Closer association Report.

WHEN Eas it is equitable that the worker should share in the profits of industry:

AND WHIRES it is incumbent upon Government among its other functions to provide SOCIAL SECURITY by way of a system of monthly insurance benefits for the worker and his family when the wage-earner is old and stops work or if he dies;

AND WHEREAS in as much as the eare in existence Unions capable of bargaining for the work with his employer there are thousands of employees who are as yet unorganised and whose sole protection is still Government;

BE IT RUSOLVED that t Honourable Council recommends to Government the appointment of a SELECT COMMITTEE to examine the question of the institution of a Contrib tory Pension Scheme for the workers of this country and to make recommendations.

WHEREAS it is desirabl, that a contributory pension scheme be establ shed for the whole Colony with universal application wherever there is the relationship of employer and employee;

AND WHERLIAS the Colony is in need of money to finance certain development schemes which would result in a greater measine of prosperity to the Colony generally, e.g., aking available through Local Banks or otherwise more money to more peasant farmers for more production of rice, cattle, milk, provision, etc., and for erection of houses;

AND WHEREAS if the afo esaid Colony-wide pension scheme be made a Government controlled undertaking, there would be a conside able revolving sum in the hands of Government whice can be used as aforesaid;

BE IT RESOLVED that this Honourable Council, accepting the principle of the establishment of a colony-wide pension so ome, recommend to Government the appointment of a Select Committee of this Council to consider and report

- (a) the establishment application of a colony-wide pension scheme;
- (b) the expediency and anner of Government controlling the s me; and
- (c) the purpose or purposes to which funds in hand of the Gover ment may be devoted in the interest of the development of the Colony.
