That, this Council accepts in principle the proposed Federation of the British Caribbean Colonies and agrees to consider in a Committee of all the unofficial m mbers of the Council the recommendations in he Closer Association Report.

Council to resume consideration of 2. The collowing motion:-

WHEREAS it is equi able that the worker should share in the profits of industry;

AND WHEREAS it is 'noumbent upon Government among its other functions to provide SOCIAL SECURITY by way of a sy ter of monthly insurance benefits for the worker and his family when the wage-earner is old and tops work or if he dies;

AND WERDAS in as fuch as there are in existence Unions cape 1 of bargaining for the work with his employer there are thousands of employees who are as yet unorganised and whose sole protection is still Government;

BE IT RESOLVED that this Honourable Council recommends to Government the appointment of a SELECT COMMITTED to examine the question of the institution of a Contributory Pension Scheme for the workers of this country and to make recommendations.

whereas it is desirable that a contributory pension scheme be estab ished for the whole Colony with universal applicat on wherever there is the relationship of employe and employee;

AND WHEREAS the Co ony is in need of money to finance certain development schemes which would result in a greater measure of prosperity to the Colony generally, e.g., making available through Local Banks or otherwis more money to more peasant farmers for more produc in of rice, cattle, milk, provision, etc., and fo erection of houses;

AND WFERMAS if the aforesaid Colony-wide pension scheme be made a Gov. rn ent controlled undertaking, there would be a considerable revolving sum in the hands of Government which can be used as aforesaid;

SE IT RESOLVED that this Honourable Council, accepting the principle of the establishment of a colony-wide pension scheme, recommend to Government the appointment of a Select Committee of this Council to consider and report on -

- (a) the establishment and application of a colony-wide pension scheme;
- (b) the expediency and manner of Government controlling the same; and
- (c) the purpose or purposes to which funds in hand of the Government may be devoted in the inte est of the development of the Colony.
