BE IT RESOLVED:

That this Council expresses its laok of confidence in and censure of the Government for the failure of the delegation which left British Guiana on 17th June to obtain development finance.

That this Council recommends to Government the introduction of legislation to provide for the protection of hire-purchasers.

That this Council recommends to Government that immediate steps be taken to establish Agricultural Machinery Stations.

That notwithstanding the decision of this Council not to enter immediately into negotiations with the West Indies Federation with a view to British Guiana joining the West Indies Federation, this Council recommends to Government that it approaches the West Indies Federation with a view to discussing economic relations between this Colony and the West Indies Federation, and to explore the possibility of British Guiana being invited to send a representative with the West Indies team to Canada.
