4. Mr. Burnham to move the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this Council recommends to Government the immediate preparation and implementation of an extensive and thorough scheme for the training of Guianese with a view to the latter's filling all the higher posts in the administrative and technical branches of the country's Public Service.

5. Mr. Jai Narine Singh to move the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this Council records its protest against the appointment by the Secretary of State for the Colonies of a non-Guianese as Postmaster General of British Guiana, and recommends to Government that steps be taken to continue unbroken the accepted policy of Guianization of the Civil Service.

That this Council recommends that Her Majesty's Government be requested to convert to an outright grant the loans made to British Guiana during the period of the Interim Government, that is, from January, 1954 to August, 1957, and to waive any interest accrued thereon.
