QUESTION: Is Government aware that during September 1961, the Director of the Marketing Division informed coffee growers in the North West District that Government was arranging for the establishment of a Coffee Board to be run on similar lines to the Rice Marketing Board, and that coffee would be processed in three grades at prices of 45¢, 35¢ and 25¢ per pound in the three grades?
