*FREEDOM OF INFORMATION BILL 2006 - Bill No. 26/2006

A BILL intituled AN ACT to give access to information to members of the public.

MOTIONS

10. <u>ALLEGATIONS OF TORTURE MADE AGAINST THE JOINT SERVICES OF</u> <u>GUYANA</u>

Mr. Aubrey Norton, M.P. to move the following motion:

WHEREAS Guyana is a Party to the United Nations Convention Against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman and Degrading Treatment or Punishment (hereinafter referred to as the Convention);

AND WHEREAS Article 141(1) of the Constitution of the Co-operative Republic of Guyana states that "No person should be subjected to torture or to inhuman or degrading punishment or other treatment";

AND WHEREAS there have been allegations of torture made against the Joint Services in Guyana by Messrs. Patrick Sumner, Victor Jones, David Leander, Michael Dunn, Alvin Wilson and Sharth Robertson;

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AND WHEREAS it is the responsibility of a State Party to the Convention to "ensure that education and information regarding the prohibition against torture are fully included in the training of law enforcement personnel, civil or military, medical personnel, public officials and other persons who may be involved in the custody, interrogation or treatment of any individual subjected to any form of arrest, detention or imprisonment",

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly calls on the Government to honour its treaty obligations under Article 12 of the Convention and establish an impartial and independent Commission to examine and investigate the allegations of torture made against the Joint Services in Guyana;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly calls on the Government to honour its treaty obligations under Article 13 of the Convention by ensuring that steps "be taken to ensure that the complainant and witnesses are protected against all ill-treatment or intimidation as a consequence of his complaint or any evidence given";

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly calls on the Government to honour its treaty obligations under Article 4(2) of the Convention by enacting the necessary legislation to give effect to the provisions of the Convention;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly calls on the Government to honour its treaty obligations under Article 14 of the Convention by ensuring that persons found to have been tortured are compensated;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the Government of Guyana honour its treaty obligations under Article 11 of the Convention and "...review interrogation rules, instructions, methods and practices as well as arrangements for the custody and treatment of persons subjected to any form of arrest, detention or imprisonment in any territory under its jurisdiction, with a view to preventing any cases of torture";

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly calls on the Government to honour its treaty obligations under Article 10 of the Convention by ensuring that public officials are made aware that all forms of torture are prohibited.

11. ACCESS TO LOCAL AND EXTERNAL TELEVISION CHANNELS, OTHER THAN NCN CHANNELS, AT LINDEN

Mrs. Sheila Holder, M.P. to move the following motion:

WHEREAS Article 146(1) of the Constitution of the Republic of Guyana provides for the protection of fundamental rights and freedoms of citizens and is the supreme law of the land and directs:

"Except with his own consent, no person shall be hindered in the enjoyment of his freedom of expression, that is to say, freedom to hold opinions without interference, freedom to receive ideas and information without interference, freedom to communicate ideas and information without interference and freedom from interference with his correspondence";

AND WHEREAS the people of Linden and Wismar have expressed to the leadership of the Alliance For Change their frustration and anger at being denied the right to access local and external television channels other than NCN channels 11 and 8 operated by the State,

BE IT RESOLVED:

That the National Assembly endorses the fundamental rights of these citizens to receive ideas and information without interference via television media other than those which are provided by NCN;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the National Assembly calls on the Government of Guyana and its National Frequency Management Unit to permit operators of private television channels in Guyana the right to relay and bean their channels in Linden and Wismar without having to attain additional licenses and pay additional fees.
