2. INCREASE IN GEOGRAPHICAL CONSTITUENCIES

Mr. Donald Ramotar to move the following motion:

WHEREAS amendments were made to the Representation Act pursuant to the Report of the Constitution Reform Commission of July 17, 1999 making recommendations on changes to the electoral system;

AND WHEREAS section 11 of the said Act was amended to provide that Guyana be divided into ten geographical constituencies for the purpose of electing Members of the National Assembly from each geographical constituency;

AND WHEREAS section 11 A of the Representation Act provides that the ten geographical constituencies shall elect twenty five Members of the National Assembly as follows: two Members for Region 1, two Members for Region 2, three Members for Region 3, seven Members for Region 4, two Members for Region 5, three Members for Region 6, two Members for Region 7, one Member for Region 8, one Member for Region 9 and two Members for Region 10;

AND WHEREAS in order to complete the reforms proposed by the Constitution Reform Commission and to consider expanding reforms already made-

BE IT RESOLVED:

That the National Assembly establishes a Special Select Committee to recommend to the National Assembly whether the twenty five seats provided for by section 11 of the Representation of the People Act should be increased and if so, by how many;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the Special Select Committee reports to the National Assembly within two months or by such earlier date as the Elections Commission may deem necessary in order to complete preparations for the 2006 General and Regional elections.

3. AMENDMENT TO STANDING ORDER NO. 73(5)

The Minister of Parliamentary Affairs to move the following motion:

WHEREAS Standing Order 73(5) provides that the deliberations of a Select Committee shall be held in private;

AND WHEREAS the said Standing Order also applies to Standing and Sectoral Committees;

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the deliberations of some Committees be held in public or in private if they so decide.

BE IT RESOLVED that:

- Standing Order 73(5) be amended to provide that meetings of the Sectoral Committees and the Public Accounts Committee be held in public except where the said Committees determine otherwise;
- 2. The said amendment be effected by:
 - (a) deleting the fullstop at the end of Standing Order 73(5) and replacing it by a colan;

(b) adding the following at the sentence as a new paragraph:

"Provided that (a) the deliberations of the Sectoral Committees and the Public Accounts Committee shall be held in public except where these Committees determine otherwise; (b) meetings of the Parliamentary Management Committee shall not be held in public".

The amended Standing Order will read after the amendment as follows:

"The deliberations of a Select Committee shall be in private and shall be confined to the matter referred to it by the Assembly and any extension or limitation thereof made by the Assembly and, in the case of a Select Committee on a Bill to the Bill committed to it and relevant amendments";

Provided that:

- (a) the deliberations of the Sectoral Committees and the Public Accounts

 Committee shall be held in public except where these Committees

 determine otherwise;
- (b) deliberations of the Parliamentary Management Committee shall not be held in public.
