 - (a) deleting the fullstop at the end of Standing Order 73(5) and replacing it by a colon;
 - (b) adding the following at the sentence as a new paragraph:

"Provided that (a) the deliberations of the Sectoral Committees and the Public Accounts Committee shall be held in public except where these Committees determine otherwise; (b) meetings of the Parliamentary Management Committee shall not be held in public".

3. After the amendment the Standing Order will read as follows:

"The deliberations of a Select Committee shall be in private and shall be confined to the matter referred to it by the Assembly and any extension or limitation thereof made by the Assembly and, in the case of a Select Committee on a Bill to the Bill committed to it and relevant amendments";

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Provided that:

- (a) the deliberations of the Sectoral Committees and the Public Accounts Committee shall be held in public except where these Committees determine otherwise;
- (b) deliberations of the Parliamentary Management Committee shall not be held in public.
