AND WHEREAS the significant contribution of Critchlow to the development of Trade Unionism in Guyana and the Caribbean has been internationally recognized and acknowledged,

BE IT RESOLVED:

That on this historic occasion the National Assembly of Guyana pays tribute to the outstanding contribution of Hubert Nathaniel Critchlow to the improvement of lives of workers, to the Trade Union Movement and to the Legislature of Guyana;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

- That this National Assembly calls on the Government of Guyana to declare November 28 henceforth "Hubert Nathaniel Critchlow Day" in acknowledgment of his heroic and pioneering contribution as an exemplar Trade Unionist and the champion of the Working Class;
- That this National Assembly declares Hubert Nathaniel Critchlow a National Hero from this day November 30, 2005.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the said Committee consider the Needs Assessment of the Guyana National Assembly Report and its Addendum and the Guyana Fiduciary Oversight Project Report (The Bradford Report) so that all recommendations relating to the oversight role of the National Assembly may be comprehensively considered and reported on to the National Assembly by January 31, 2006.
