## 1. <u>ESTABLISHMENT OF OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE</u> RE CONSTITUTIONAL REFORM

The Minister of Agriculture and Parliamentary Affairs to move the following motion:

WHEREAS the National Assembly of the Parliament of Guyana, on 9<sup>th</sup> August, 1999, approved of the establishment of a Special Select Committee to consider the Report of the Constitution Reform Commission;

AND WHEREAS the Special Select Committee presented its Report to the National Assembly on 11<sup>th</sup> November, 1999;

#### BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly of the Parliament of Guyana -

- Express its thanks to the Special Select Committee for its Report, and
- ♦ Adopt the Report of the Committee;

#### AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the Government, in consultation with the Political Parties represented in the National Assembly, and with civil society as necessary, establish forthwith an Oversight Committee with appropriate Terms of Reference and Authority, that is charged with the responsibilities of:

> Preparing for the approval of the Assembly, a time-bound plan for the drafting of Constitutional Revision;

Overseeing and guiding the implementation of the Recommendations of the Report of the Special Select Committee; and

Submitting written monthly progress reports to the Assembly, the first such report being made not later than 31st December, 1999;

♦ That the Oversight Committee be required to give priority to the establishment and functioning of separate Task Forces mandated to pursue, in accordance with the target dates of the Herdmanston Accord, the implementation of the recommendations pertaining to:

Reform of the Electoral System; and
Establishment of the Ethnic Relations Commission.

# 2. RATIFICATION OF PROTOCOL III WHICH AMENDS THE TREATY ESTABLISHING THE CARIBBEAN COMMUNITY

The Minister of Foreign Affairs to move the following motion:

WHEREAS Protocol III amending the Treaty Establishing the Caribbean Community signed at Chaguaramas on 4 July 1973 was signed by ten Heads of Government at the Nineteenth Meeting of the Conference of Heads of Government of the Caribbean Community which was held in Castries, St. Lucia during the period 30 June - 4 July, 1998;

AND WHEREAS the said Protocol III was signed by Her Excellency Janet Jagan, the President of Guyana on behalf of the Government of Guyana;

AND WHEREAS the said Protocol provides for an Industrial Policy within the Community within the context of the Single Market and Economy;

AND WHEREAS Protocol III amending the Treaty establishing the Caribbean Community has as its primary goal the achievement of an export-led, internationally competitive sustainable production of goods services in Member States, and which will maximize employment and consumer welfare;

AND WHEREAS Guyana remains committed to the established goals and objectives of the Caribbean Community in this new era of globalisation;

#### BE IT RESOLVED:

That the National Assembly hereby agrees to the Secretary General of the Caribbean Community being informed of Guyana's intention to ratify the said Protocol III and for Guyana to formally ratify the said Protocol III by the deposit of an appropriate Instrument of Ratification.

### 3. RATIFICATION OF PROTOCOL V WHICH AMENDS THE TREATY ESTABLISHING THE CARIBBEAN COMMUNITY

That the National Assembly hereby agrees to the Secretary General of the Caribbean Community being informed of Guyana's intention to ratify the said Protocol V and for Guyana to formally ratify the said Protocol V by the deposit of an appropriate instrument of Ratification.
