4. <u>ADOPTION AND RATIFICATION OF I.L.O. CONVENTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS</u>

The Minister of Manpower and Co-operatives to move the following motion:

WHEREAS as a member State of the International Labour Organisation Guyana is obligated to examine Conventions and Recommendations adopted by the International Labour Conference in accordance with Article 19 of the Constitution of the International Labour Organisation;

AND WHEREAS Article 19 states that all Conventions and Recommendations adopted by the International Labour Conference must be submitted to the Competent Authority of member States whether ratification of such Coventions is contemplated or not;

AND WHEREAS the submission of Conventions and Recommendations adopted at sessions of that Conference should always be accompanied or followed by a statement or proposals setting out the Government's views as to the action to be taken on the instruments;

AND WHEREAS Guyana adheres to the Constitution of the International Labour Organisation of which it is a member since 1966;

AND WHEREAS the Guyana Government always as an aim of policy, makes proposals at the time of submission on the applicability of the Conventions and Recommendations adopted from time to time at sessions of the International Labour Conference;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Guyana always takes steps to ratify those Conventions which are in keeping with the social philosophy of the Guyanese society:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly adopt the following Conventions and Recommendations adopted at the 67th and 68th Sessions of the International Labour Conference held in Geneva in June, 1981 and June 1982, respectively, and laid in the National Assembly on 2nd November, 1984:-
