WHEREAS the people of Nicaragua, having freed themselves from the fascist Somoza dictatorship, are seeking to build a revolutionary-democratic non-aligned society under the leadership of the Dandinistas; AND WHEREAS within recent times there has been an intensification of military manoeuvres in Central America and the Caribbean by units of the Armed Forces of the USA leading to an increase in tension in the region;

AND WHEREAS many peace-loving forces including the Non-aligned Movement and especially the Contadora Group, are working assiduously for the peaceful negotiated settlement of the problems of Central America;

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly condemn all hostile actions, including specifically those of a military nature, which are directed against the sovereignty and territorial integrity of Nicaragua;

DE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly urge all States of the hemisphere to adhere to the Contadora Act for Peace and Co-operation which has already been accepted by Nicaragua•
