4. RELEASE OF NELSON MANDELA

The Minister of Foreign Affairs to move the following motion:

WHEREAS the Government and people of Guyana have always unreservedly supported morally, politically and materially the oppressed masses in South Africa in their long and arduous struggle against the evil system of apartheid;

AND WHEREAS the vanguard role in that struggle of the Liberation Movements such as the African National Congress (ANC) has been widely acknowledged;

AND WHEREAS the apartheid regime has over the years unjustly imprisoned popular leaders like the renowned Nelson Mandela and incarcerated numerous other political prisoners;

AND WHEREAS the de Klerk Administration in South Africa, under mounting internal and external pressure, released Nelson Mandela unconditionally on February 11, 1990:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly welcome the long overdue unconditional release of Nelson Mandela;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That this Assembly urge the Government to continue to give its full support to Nelson Mandela and the Liberation Movement in South Africa in the struggle for the dismantlement of the obnoxious system of apartheid.
