*7. <u>REVIEW OF CONSTITUTION</u>

Cde. K.B. Bancroft to move the following motions

WHEREAS the present Constitution of Guyana was promulgated on 6th October, 1980;

AND WHEREAS a Constitu**ent**. Assembly had been established to take evidence from the public and to submit a draft Constitution to the National Assembly;

AND WHEREAS the said draft Constitution was debated in the National Assembly and, with some amendments, was passed into law as the present Constitution;

AND WHEREAS the People's Progressive Party, the largest minority party in the National Assembly, had boycotted the Constituent Assembly and made no contribution to the fashioning of the present Constitution;

AND WHEREAS on 6th October, 1990, the said Constitution would have been in existence for a decade;

AND WHEREAS it seems appropriate and timelyto review the said Constitution to see how well its various provisions have worked in securing its objectives of a democratic society based on the Rule Law in which all citizens can find full scope for participation in the social, cultural and political life of the country;

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly appoint a select committee to study this issue and report to the National Assembly its opinion an whether it is desirable and appropriate that the Constitution be reviewed;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That should the Select Committee report in the affirmative, the National Assembly urge the Government to set in train appropriate processes for a National review of the Constitution.
