No. 1 - BILLS AFFECTING STATUS OF WOMEN

No. 2 - SIMAP BENEFITS FOR RETIRED WATERFRONT WORKERS

QUESTION: (i) In view of the fact that retired waterfront workers get an average of about \$130 per month as pension, will the Minister agree to include this group of workers among vulnerable groups in considering SIMAP support payments?

- (ii) As their number is relatively small, will the Minister consider applying any such benefits as lasting while the need for SIMAP support to vulnerable groups is necessary?

PRESIDENT'S COLLEGE BILL 1990 - Bill No. 14, 1990

WHEREAS the Amerindian Act, Chapter 29:01, section 18, provides for the establishment of Amerindian Councils for the control of lands that fall within the boundaries of each Amerindian settlement:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That squatters occupying lands in Amerindian settlements, as in the case of Capoey Amerindian settlement, Essequibo, be removed forthwith and the Amerindian Council be allowed to develop the lands without interference and hindrance.

Cde. H. Nokta to move the following motion:

WHEREAS the Amerindian Hostel at Charity, Pomeroon, has been used as an office for over two years by GUYCONSTRUCT;

BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Hostel be vacated by GUYCONSTRUCT and handed back forthwith to the Amerindian community in good condition.

*3. REVIEW OF CONSTITUTION

Cde. K.B. Bancroft to move the following motion:

WHEREAS the present Constitution of Guyana was promulgated on 6th October, 1980;

AND WHEREAS a Constituent Assembly had been established to take evidence from the public and to submit a draft Constitution to the National Assembly;

AND WHEREAS the said draft Constitution was debated in the National Assembly and, with some amendments, was passed into law as the present Constitution;

AND WHEREAS the People's Progressive Party, the largest minority party in the National Assembly, had boycotted the Constituent Assembly and made no contribution to the fashioning of the present Constitution;

AND WHEREAS on 6th October, 1990, the said Constitution would have been in existence for a decade;

AND WHEREAS it seems appropriate and timely to review the said Constitution to see how well its various provisions have worked in securing its objectives of a democratic society based on the Rule Law in which all citizens can find full scope for participation in the social, cultural and political life of the country;

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly appoint a select committee to study this issue and report to the National Assembly its opinion on whether it is desirable and appropriate that the Constitution be reviewed;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That should the Select Committee report in the affirmative, the National Assembly urge the Government to set in train appropriate processes for a National review of the Constitution.
