1. RESTRICTIONS ON IMPORTATION OF WHEATEN FLOUR AND SPLIT PEAS

Cde. Reepu Daman Persaud to move the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly requests the Government to remove all restrictions that impede the importation of heaten flour and split peas.

2. MEDICAL FACILITIES IN THE INTERIOR

Cde. Janet Jagan to move the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That the National Assembly recommends that adequate medical personnel be provided in all rural and interior districts and that all health centres be staffed and also provided with sufficient drugs, medical supplies and means of communication so that they can give positive assistance.

3. PROVISION OF WATER

Cde. Janet Jagan to move the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That the National Assembly urges the Government to solve the many pure water supply problems existing throughout the country and resolve to provide every community with a functioning potable water system.

4. IMPORTATION OF MILK

Cde. Janet Jagan to move the following motion:

WHEREAS there are insufficient supplies of milk, either locally produced or imported, to meet the needs of the child population, as well as the needs of adults;

AND WHEREAS milk cannot be eliminated from the diet of our children:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That the National Assembly calls on the Government to see that adequate supplies of milk are imported and equitably distributed in order to supplement the present inadequate supplies of locally-produced milk.

5. LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS

Cde. Reepu Daman Persaud to move the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly calls on the Government to hold Local Government Elections immediately after a re-constituted Elections Commission has been appointed, a new voters' list prepared and the presence of a Caricom or Commonwealth Observers' Team agreed upon.

6. CHARGES OF DISCRIMINATION IN THE ADMINISTRATION

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly agrees to the appointment of a Parliamentary Committee including representatives of the TUC to investigate all charges of discrimination in the administration and all its agencies and to submit reports to the Assembly.

7. CHARGES BY CORPORATIONS

Cde. Reepu Daman Persaud to move the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That all variations upwards in the charges made by Corporations providing a service to the community be subject to approval by the National Assembly.

8. AGREEMENTS WITH IMF

Cde. Reepu Daman Persaud to move the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That before any other Agreement is signed with the IMF, the terms and conditions be debated in the National Assembly.

9. INCOME TAX RELIEFS

Cde. Reepu Daman Persaud to move the following motion:

WHEREAS the income tax laws and regulations make no provision for certain dependent relatives over the age of 16 who are unmarried, have no children and are unemployed, even though they are dependent on the tax-payer for living expenses;

AND WHEREAS there are many single-parent families, where one person is the sole provider, but no special tax allowances are made for this human situation;

AND WHEREAS many persons have savings in co-operative societies and credit unions;

BE IT RESOLVED:

- That - (i) allowances be given for dependent relatives over the age of 16 once they are unmarried and unemployed;
- (ii) an additional personal allowance be given heads of one-parent families, and
- (iii) income tax relief be given on savings in co-operative societies and credit unions.
