THE SHOPS (CONSOLIDATION) ORDINANCE, 1958, (No. 23 of 1958).

UNDER THE PROVISO TO SECTION 3 OF THE SHOPS (CONSOLIDATION) ORDINANCE, 1958, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Shops Hours (Special Provision) (No. 2) Order, 1966.

2. Every shop, other than a restaurant, parlour or cookshop, barber or hairdresser's establishment, within the urban area (as defined in section 2 of the Shops (Consolidation) Ordinance, 1958,) the occupier of which notifies the Commissioner of Police not later than the 20th day of May, 1966, that the shop will be open during the hours of 9.30 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. on the 23rd or 24th May, 1966, or on both such dates, may be open during the said hours on the date or dates so notified.

3. Every shop, other than a restaurant, parlour or cookshop, barber or hairdresser's establishment as aforesaid may be open during the hours of 7.30 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. on the 25th May, 1966.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Order permits certain shops situate in the city of Georgetown as comprised within the boundaries set out in the Georgetown Town Council Ordinance and an area within one mile of the eastern boundary thereof and shops situate in the town of New Amsterdam as comprised within the boundaries set out in the New Amsterdam Town Council Ordinance, to be open on the 23rd, 24th and 25th May 1966, during the hours specified in the Order.
