THE WAGES COUNCILS ORDINANCE, 1956

(No. 51 of 1956)

UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ORDINANCE, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR GENERAL AS FOLLOWS:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Printing Trade Wages Council Wages Regulation Order, 1967.
 - 2. In this Order—
 - "printing trade worker" means any person employed in a printery;
 - "printery" means any place or premises in which printing by letterpress, lithography, photogravure, or other similar process, or bookbinding is carried on by way of trade or for purposes of gain or incidental to another business so carried on, but shall not include copying by office typewriter or office duplicating machine.
- 3. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Order the minimum rate of wages at which a printing trade worker shall be paid, shall be as set out in the schedule hereto:

Provided that where upon the commencement of this Order a printing trade worker is in receipt of a wage greater than that prescribed in this Order, the employer shall nevertheless continue to pay the said worker wages at the higher rate.

- (2) A printing trade worker who is a casual employee and is required to work less than seven hours in any one day shall be paid for that day at the hourly rate prescribed in the schedule to this Order for his category and he shall in addition receive twenty per centum of that rate.
- 4. Where a printing trade worker habitually performs work in a category higher than the category to which he properly belongs in accordance with the classification prescribed in the shedule to this Order he shall be paid wages at the rate payable in respect of the higher category as prescribed by the said schedule.
 - 5. This Order shall come into operation on the 17th day of July, 1967.
