

GUYANA

ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE TRADE ORDINANCE, 1958,
(No. 34 of 1958).

UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE TRADE ORDINANCE, 1958, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL AS FOLLOWS:—

Citation and commencement.
No. 8 of 1968.

1. This Order may be cited as the Trade (Caribbean Free Trade Association) Order, 1968, and shall come into operation on the day proclaimed under subsection (2) of section 2 of the Customs (Amendment) Act, 1968.

Interpretation.

2. In this Order —

Cap. 309.

“Association Territory” means any territory for the time being mentioned in Part IIA of the first schedule to the Customs Ordinance;

No. 88 of 1963.

“the Order” means the Trade (Control of Import and Export) (No. 2) Order, 1963.

Exemption.

3. Without prejudice to the provisions of paragraph 4 hereof, nothing in the Order shall be deemed to prohibit any importation or exportation of goods from or to any Association Territory, except in so far as any such prohibition relates to —

First schedule.

(a) goods specified in the first schedule hereto;

Second schedule.

(b) the importation or exportation of goods specified in the second schedule hereto from or to any Association Territory not being Barbados, Dominica, Grenada, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent or Trinidad and Tobago; and

(c) the importation of sugar.

Restriction of importation of goods listed in third schedule.

4. No goods specified in the third schedule hereto shall be imported from any country except under the authority of an import licence granted by the Competent Authority, for which application shall be made in the manner prescribed by article 6 of the Order;

Provided that article 5 of the Order, exclusive of paragraph (c) thereof, shall *mutatis mutandis* apply in relation to the foregoing provisions of this paragraph as that article applies in relation to the provisions of article 2 of the Order.

5. References to the Order in articles 7, 8 and 10 thereof shall be construed to include references to this Order.

Extension
of articles
7, 8 and 10

6. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 3 of this Order, nothing in this Order authorises the importation or exportation of any goods the importation or exportation of which is prohibited or restricted by any laws at present in force or which may be enacted hereafter.
