THE BAKERIES (HOURS OF WORK) ORDINANCE
(CHAPTER 120)

UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE BAKERIES (HOURS OF WORK) ORDINANCE, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING ME IN THAT BEHALF, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Bakeries (Hours of Work) (Special Provision) (Beharry's Bakery) Order, 1969.

2. Subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of section 4 of the Bakeries (Hours of Work) Ordinance, the restrictions imposed by section 3 of the said Ordinance shall not apply in respect of employment in the bakery known as Beharry's Bakery situate at 21, Hadfield and John Streets, Georgetown, during the period 12th August, 1969 to 22nd August, 1969 (both dates inclusive) and persons may be employed in the said bakery during the said period in the manufacture of bread and flour confectionery, or in any work incidental thereto, between seven o'clock in the evening of any day and five o'clock in the forenoon of the next following day.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order)

For the purpose of meeting the demand for the supply of bread to the Scouts participating in the Scouts' Jamboree to be held in Guyana in August, 1969, this Order removes for a limited period in respect of employment in Beharry's Bakery the restrictions on the hours of work in Bakeries imposed by the Bakeries (Hours of Work) Ordinance, Chapter 120.
