MADE UNDER

THE ACQUISITION OF LANDS FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES ORDINANCE, (Chapter 179).

WHEREAS by Order No. 7 of 1969 made on the 22nd March, 1969, the proposed construction of an overhead water tank on the land described in the schedule to that Order was declared to be a public work under section 3 of the Acquisition of Lands for Public Purposes Ordinance;

AND WHEREAS by the said Order the Chief Works and Hydraulics Officer together with his agents, servants or workmen was authorised under section 4 of the Ordinance aforesaid to enter upon the said land for the purpose of surveying or otherwise examining such land with a view to the acquisition of the whole or a part thereof for the construction of the public work aforesaid;

AND WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of section 6 of the Ordinance aforesaid, the report of the Chief Works and Hydraulics Officer and a plan of the land to be acquired have been laid before the Governor-General;

NOW THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of the said section 6, it is hereby declared that the land described in the schedule to this Order is required for the public work aforesaid.

This Order may be cited as the Acquisition of Lands for Public Purposes (Construction of Over-head tank) (Plantation Rome) (No. 2) Order, 1969.

SCHEDULE

A tract of land, being part of Plantation Rome situate on the right bank of the Demerara River, commencing at the iron paal marked M.W.H., approximately 48 feet west of a point on the centre line of the East Bank Public Road that point being approximately 96 feet north of the centre line of the road leading to Shell Antilles Limited, and extending N 75° 56' 00" W (tr.) for a distance of 115.28 feet to a wooden paal marked R.H.I. thence S 20° 05' 00" W (tr.) for a distance on a plan dated 10th June, 1969, by Randolph Herbert Isaa veyor on deposit in the Deeds Registry as Plan No. 6280. of 113.05 feet to a wooden paal marked R.H.I. thence N 76° 57' 00" E (tr.) for a distance of 139.00 feet to a wooden paal marked R.H.I., thence N 18° 05' 00" E (tr.) for a distance of 49.42 feet to the point of commencement, with the building thereon, the said tract of land containing 0.2163 acres, shown bordered "red" on a plan dated 10th June, 1969, by Randolph Herbert Isaacs, Sworn Land Sur-
