THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 309)

UNDER SECTION 8 OF THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE MINISTER RESPONSIBLE FOR FINANCE AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Duties (Amendment) (No. 6) Order, 1969.
2. The last paragraph of item 11 of Part 111 of the First Schedule to the Customs Ordinance is hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor —

“Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this item —

- (i) prune wine and blending sherry when imported for use in the manufacture of rum in bonded premises;
- (ii) malt whisky imported for use in the manufacture in Guyana of whisky consisting of imported spirit to an extent not exceeding thirty per centum in reference to the total proof gallons manufactured;
- (iii) brandy concentrates imported for use in the manufacture in Guyana of brandy consisting of imported spirit to an extent not exceeding thirty per centum in reference to the total proof gallons manufactured; and
- (iv) liqueur concentrates imported for use in the manufacture in Guyana of Creme de Menthe, Cherry Brandy and Creme de Cacao Liqueurs, respectively, consisting of imported spirit to an extent not exceeding .07 per centum, 29 per centum and 14 per centum in reference to the total proof gallons manufactured, respectively, shall be exempted from import duty”.
