THE VALUATION FOR RATING PURPOSES ACT, 1969. (No. 11 of 1969)

UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE VALUATION FOR RATING PURPOSES ACT, 1969, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE MINISTER AS FOL-LOWS :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Valuation for Rating Purposes (Preparation of Valuation Lists) Order, 1969.

2. The Valuation Officer is hereby directed to prepare a valuation list for the areas mentioned in Parts I and II of the Schedule hereto.

3. The area designated in the first column of Part II of the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be an area proposed to be amalgamated with the local authority mentioned in the second column of that Part.

4. The day on which the Valuation Officer shall commence the preparation of the valuation list shall be Saturday, 1st November, 1969, and the date at which all property in the aforesaid areas shall be valued shall be 1st November, 1969.
