

ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE MUNICIPAL AND DISTRICT COUNCILS ACT, 1969,
(No. 24 of 1969).

UNDER SECTION 33 OF THE MUNICIPAL AND DISTRICT COUNCILS ACT, 1969, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE MINISTER AS FOLLOWS :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Upper Corentyne Local Government District (Constitution) Order, 1970.
2. That portion of Guyana in the county of Berbice, the boundaries of which are set out in the schedule, is hereby established as a local government district to be known by the name of "The Upper Corentyne Local Government District", hereinafter referred to as "the district".
3. The district council for the district shall have the name of "the Upper Corentyne District Council", hereinafter referred to as "the District Council", and shall consist of fifteen councillors.
4. The District Council may, in each year, appropriate out of its funds a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars to be placed at the disposal of the Chairman payable in equal instalments at the end of each quarter of the year.
5. The District Council shall appoint and at all times maintain a Finance Committee and a Works Committee as Standing Committees.
6. There shall be a Superintendent of Works for the District Council.
7. The District Council shall have power to do all or any of the things specified in section 301 of the Act except the things specified in paragraphs (22) and (26) thereof.

SCHEDULE

Clause 2

BOUNDARIES OF THE UPPER CORENTYNE LOCAL GOVERNMENT
DISTRICT—

Being all that area situate in the County of Berbice and bounded as follows—

- On the North — by the southern boundary of the reserve for Lots 51/52 Drainage Canal.
- On the South — by the Northern boundaries of No. 75, and the tract held by Bookers Demerara Sugar Estates Limited under Licence of Occupancy 2092.
- On the East — by the Corentyne River and the Atlantic Ocean.
- On the West — by the Seaford Dam.
