

ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE MUNICIPAL AND DISTRICT COUNCILS ACT, 1969,
(No. 24 of 1969).

UNDER SECTION 33 OF THE MUNICIPAL AND DISTRICT COUNCILS ACT, 1969, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE MINISTER AS FOLLOWS :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Bush Lot/Adventure Local Government District (Constitution) Order, 1970.
2. That portion of Guyana in the county of Berbice, the boundaries of which are set out in the schedule, is hereby established as a local government district to be known by the name of "The Bush Lot/Adventure Local Government District", hereinafter referred to as "the district".
3. The district council for the district shall have the name of "The Bush Lot/Adventure District Council", hereinafter referred to as "the District Council", and shall consist of fifteen councillors.
4. The District Council may, in each year, appropriate out of its funds a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars to be placed at the disposal of the Chairman payable in equal instalments at the end of each quarter of the year.
5. The District Council shall appoint and at all times maintain a Finance Committee as a Standing Committee.
6. There shall be a Superintendent of Works for the District Council.
7. The District Council shall have power to do all or any of the things specified in section 301 of the Act except the things specified in paragraphs (22) and (26) thereof.

SCHEDULE

Clause 2

BOUNDARIES OF THE BUSH LOT/ADVENTURE LOCAL GOVERNMENT
DISTRICT—

Being all that area situate in the County of Berbice and bounded as follows—

- On the North — by the Atlantic Ocean.
- On the South. — by the northern boundary of the Water Course North of Lots 92-111 at South Lesbeholden, Black Bush Polder.
- On the East — by the eastern boundary of the Ketting between No. 27 and No. 28, and its prolongation southwards, and the Western boundary of the reserve for the Mibikuri Distributary.
- On the West — by the eastern boundary of the reserve for the Lesbeholden Main Drain.
