ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE MUNICIPAL AND DISTRICT COUNCILS ACT, 1969, (No. 24 of 1969).

UNDER SECTION 33 OF THE MUNICIPAL AND DISTRICT COUNCILS ACT, 1969, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE MINISTER AS FOLLOWS:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Riverstown/Annandale Local Government District (Constitution) Order, 1970.
- 2. That portion of Guyana in the county of Essequibo, the boundaries of which are set out in the schedule, is hereby established as a local government district to be known by the name of "The Riverstown/Annandale Local Government District", hereinafter referred to as "the district".
- 3. The District Council for the district shall have the name of "The Riverstown/Annandale District Council", hereinafter referred to as "The District Council", and shall consist of twelve councillors.
- 4. The District Council may, in each year, appropriate out of its funds a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars to be placed at the disposal of the Chairman payable in equal instalments at the end of each quarter of the year.
- 5. The District Council shall appoint and at all times maintain a Finance Committee as a Standing Committee.
 - 6. There shall be a Superintendent of Works for the District Council.
- 7. The District Council shall have power to do all or any of the things specified in section 301 of the Act except the things specified in paragraphs (22) and (26) thereof.

SCHEDULE

Clause 2

BOUNDARIES OF THE RIVERSTOWN/ANNANDALE LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRICT—

Being all that area situate in the County of Essequibo and bounded as follows---

On the North -- by the northern boundary of the Company Path between Zorgen Vliet and Annandale.

On the East — by the Essequibo River and the Atlantic Ocean.

On the West — by the back boundaries of the estates extending from Riverstown to Annandale, both inclusive
