#### ORDER

#### MADE UNDER

## THE MUNICIPAL AND DISTRICT COUNCILS ACT, 1969, (No. 24 of 1969).

## UNDER SECTION 33 OF THE MUNICIPAL AND DISTRICT COUNCILS ACT, 1969, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE MINISTER AS FOLLOWS :---

1. This Order may be cited as the Plaisance/Industry Local Government District (Constitution) Order, 1970.

2. That portion of Guyana in the county of Demerara, the boundaries of which are set out in the schedule, is hereby established as a local government district to be known by the name of "The Plaisance/Industry Local Government District", hereinafter referred to as "the district".

3. The District Council for the district shall have the name of "The Plaisance/Industry District Council", hereinafter referred to as "the District Council", and shall consist of fifteen councillors.

4. The District Council may, in each year, appropriate out of its funds a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars to be placed at the disposal of the Chairman payable in equal instalments at the end of each quarter of the year.

5. The District Council shall appoint and at all times maintain-

- (a) a Finance Committee;
- (b) a Works Committee;
- (c) a Market Committee;
- (d) a Health Committee,

as Standing Committees.

6. There shall be a Health Officer, a Superintendent of Works and a Clerk of the Market for the District Council.

7. The District Council shall have power to do all or any of the things specified in section 301 of the Act except the things specified in paragraphs (22) and (26) thereof.

# BOUNDARIES OF THE PLAISANCE/INDUSTRY LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRICT---

Being all that area situate in the County of Demerara and bounded as follows-

- On the North by the Atlantic Ocean.
- On the South by the East Demerara Water Supply Canal.
- On the East by the common boundary between Better Hope and Plaisance, and its prolongation southwards.
- On the West by the eastern boundary of the Company Path between Industry and Cummings Lodge, and its prolongation southwards.
