

ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE MUNICIPAL AND DISTRICT COUNCILS ACT, 1969,
(No. 24 of 1969).

UNDER SECTION 33 OF THE MUNICIPAL AND DISTRICT COUNCILS ACT, 1969, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE MINISTER AS FOLLOWS :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Canals Polder Local Government District (Constitution) Order, 1970.
2. That portion of Guyana in the county of Demerara, the boundaries of which are set out in the schedule, is hereby established as a local government district to be known by the name of "The Canals Polder Local Government District", hereinafter referred to as "the district".
3. The district council for the district shall have the name of "The Canals Polder District Council", hereinafter referred to as "the District Council", and shall consist of fifteen councillors.
4. The District Council may, in each year, appropriate out of its funds a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars to be placed at the disposal of the Chairman payable in equal instalments at the end of each quarter of the year.
5. The District Council shall appoint and at all times maintain a Finance Committee and a Works Committee as Standing Committees.
6. There shall be a Superintendent of Works for the District Council
7. The District Council shall have power to do all or any of the things specified in section 301 of the Act except the things specified in paragraphs (22) and (26) thereof.

SCHEDULE

Clause 2

BOUNDARIES OF THE CANALS POLDER LOCAL GOVERNMENT DISTRICT—

Being all that area situate in the County of Demerara and bounded as follows—

On the North — by a line 12 feet south of the southern edge of the Polder Canal known as the "A" line from its western junction with the Polder Service Canal Dam to the common boundary between Plantations Java and Lust Tot Rust;

- On the South — by a line 12 feet north of the northern edge of the Polder Canal known as the No. 3 or South Service Canal from the Casey Dam westwards to a point 12 feet east of the eastern edge of the Polder Conservancy dam;
- On the East — by the common boundary between Plantations Java and Lust Tot Rust and the prolongation thereof to the southern edge of the Public Road south of No. 1 Canal, the southern edge of the Public Road eastwards to the common boundary between Plantations L'Heureuse Aventure and Bagotville, the common boundary between Plantations L'Heureuse Aventure and Bagotville, Nismes and Toevlugt, the common boundary between Plantations L'Heureuse Aventure and La Retraite, to Plantation Middlesex, the common boundary between Plantations Middlesex and La Retraite to a point 12 feet north of the northern edge of the Public Road north of No. 2 Canal, the northern edge of the Public Road, westwards to a point opposite the common boundary between Plantations The Bell and Mon Desir the common boundary between The Bell and Mon Desir known as Casey Dam to a point 12 feet north of the northern edge of the Polder Canal known as No. 3 or South Service Canal.
- On the West — by a line 12 feet east of the eastern edge of the Polder Conservancy dam from its junction on the north with a point 12 feet south of the southern edge of the "A" line to its junction on the south with a point 21 feet north of the northern edge of the No. 3 or South Service Canal.
