THE TRADE ORDINANCE, 1958
(No. 34 of 1958).

UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE TRADE ORDINANCE, 1958, IT IS HEREBY
ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order which amends the Trade (Control of Prices) Order, 1969* may be cited as the Trade (Control of Prices) (Amendment) (No. 17) Order, 1971.

2. The first schedule to the Trade (Control of Prices) Order, 1969 is hereby amended —

- (a) by the substitution in Part A thereof for the particulars appearing in the third, fourth and fifth columns, respectively of the Part against the article of foodstuff mentioned in the second column thereof and numbered 22 (Garlic), of the particulars appearing in the third, fourth and fifth columns of Part A of the schedule to this Order against the same article of foodstuff mentioned in the second column thereof and of the said respective number; and
- (b) by the substitution in Part B thereof for the particulars appearing in the third, fourth and fifth columns respectively, of that Part against the article of foodstuff mentioned in the second column thereof and numbered 22 (Garlic), of the particulars appearing in the third, fourth and fifth columns of Part B of the schedule to this Order against the same article of foodstuff mentioned in the second column thereof and of the said respective number.
