I EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON ME BY SECTION
8 OF THE MINISTERS, MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY
AND SPECIAL OFFICES (EMOLUMENTS) ORDINANCE 1965, I
HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Ministers, Members of the National Assembly and Special Offices (Emoluments) (No. 2) Order 1973 and, save as otherwise provided by paragraphs (2) and (3), shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st July, 1973.

(2) (a) The provisions of the schedule, in so far as they relate to the office of Senior Minister, shall be deemed to have come into operation on 24th July, 1973;

(b) the provisions of the schedule (other than paragraph 1) in so far as they relate to the office of Attorney-General, shall be deemed to have come into operation on 24th July, 1973.

(3) Clause 3 shall be deemed to have come into operation on 24th July, 1973.

2. The schedule to this Order is hereby substituted for the schedule to the Ordinance.

3. The Ministers, Members of the National Assembly and Special Office (Emoluments) Order 1973 is hereby revoked.

4. The professional allowance paid to the holder of the office of Attorney-General for the period commencing on 1st July, 1973 and ending on 23rd July, 1973 shall be in lieu of the duty allowance which would, but for this clause, have been payable to him as a Minister for that period by virtues of this Order.

2. The persons holding the respective offices specified hereunder shall be paid duty allowances at the respective rates specified hereunder in respect of the said offices —

Prime Minister	\$12,000 per annum
Deputy Prime Minister	\$ 9,600 per annum
Senior Minister	... \$ 9,000 per annum
Every other Minister (other than a Minister of State)	\$ 6,000 per annum
Minister of State	\$ 4,800 per annum
Attorney-General (if he is not a Minister)	\$ 4,800 per annum
Parliamentary Secretary	\$ 3,000 per annum
Speaker of the National Assembly	\$ 6,000 per annum

Leader of the Opposition	\$ 6,000 per annum
Government Chief Whip	\$ 3,000 per annum
Opposition Chief Whip	\$ 3,000 per annum
Every other Member of the National Assembly	\$ 1,800 per annum

3. The persons holding the respective offices specified hereunder shall be paid entertainment allowances at the respective rates specified hereunder in respect of the said offices —

Prime Minister	\$12,000 per annum
Deputy Prime Minister	\$ 6,000 per annum
Senior Minister	\$ 3,000 per annum
Every other Minister	\$ 1,800 per annum
Speaker of the National Assembly	\$ 3,000 per annum
Attorney-General (if he is not a Senior Minister)	\$ 2,400 per annum

4. (a) The house allowance to be paid under section 3 to the Prime Minister shall be \$1,000 per month.
- (b) The Deputy Prime Minister shall be entitled to occupy free of rent a furnished residence provided by the Government, or in lieu thereof, he shall be entitled to be paid a house allowance of \$500 per month.
- (c) A Senior Minister shall be entitled to occupy free of rent a furnished residence provided by the Government, or in lieu thereof, he shall be entitled to be paid a house allowance of \$350 per month.
- (d) The Attorney-General (if he is not a Senior Minister) shall be entitled to occupy free of rent a furnished residence provided by the Government, or in lieu thereof, he shall be entitled to be paid a house allowance of \$250 per month.
- (e) The Speaker of the National Assembly shall be paid a house allowance of \$250 per month.

5. If the office of Speaker of the National Assembly is vacant the Deputy Speaker shall, in lieu thereof, be paid the salary and allowances prescribed under this Ordinance in respect of the office of Speaker of the National Assembly.”
