THE MINISTERS, MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY AND SPECIAL OFFICES (EMOLUMENTS) ORDINANCE 1965

(No. 7 of 1965)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON ME BY SECTION 4 OF THE MINISTERS, MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY AND SPECIAL OFFICES (EMOLUMENTS) ORDINANCE 1965, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

1. (1) This Order, which amends the Ministers, Members of the National Assembly and Special Offices (Allowances) Order 1965*, may be cited as the Ministers, Members of the National Assembly and Special Offices (Allowances) (Amendment) Order 1973.

(2) This Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st July, 1973.

2. The schedule to the Principal Order is hereby amended in the following respects —

- (a) by the substitution of the following paragraph for paragraph 1---
 - "1 (1) The Prime Minister shall be entitled to be provided by the Government with an official car for use on official duties and to a commuted travelling allowance of \$350 per month.
 - (2) Every other Minister and the Attorney-General shall be entitled to be provided by the Government with an official car for use on official duties or, in lieu thereof, he shall be entitled to be paid a commuted travelling allowance of \$350 per month.
 - (3) The Prime Minister, every other Minister and the Attorney-General shall be paid an allowance of **\$23**5

- **per month** to meet the expenses incurred by him in respect of the employment of a chauffeur.";
- (b) by the substitution of the number "200" for the number '130" in paragraph 2(a);
- (c) by the substitution of the number "350" for the number "250" in paragraph 3;
- (d) by the insertion of the words "and the Attorney-G rai" immediately after the word "Minister" where it first appears in paragraph 13; and
- (e) by the insertion of the words "or the Attorney-General, as the case may be," immediately after the word "Minister" in the proviso to paragraph 13.
