THE CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICES (REMUNERATION OF HOLDERS) ACT

(Chapter 27:11)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON ME BY SECTION 3 OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICES (REMUNERATION OF HOLDERS) ACT, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

1.(1) This Order may be cited as the Constitutional Offices (Holders' Allowances) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order 1975.

(2) Clause 2 shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st February, 1975 and clause 3 shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st April, 1975.

2. Clause 5 of the Principal Order is hereby amended by the insertion of the words ", the Chairman of the Elections Commission" after the word "Prosecutions".

3. Clause 6 of the Principal Order is hereby revoked and the following clause substituted therefor —

Allowances. 6.(1) Every judge of the Supreme Court, the Ombudsman, the Director of Public Prosecutions, the Chairman of the Elections Commission, the Director of Audit, the Commissioner of Police and every member of a Service Commission (not being a judge of the Supreme Court) shall be paid a travelling allowance, in respect of the use of his motor car on official duty, at the Scale C rate of travelling allowance payable to public officers and subject to the conditions of payment from time to time applying to those officers.

- (2) There shall be paid to
 - (a) the Chairman of the Elections Commission, and every member of a Service Commission referred to in paragraph (1), not being the owner of a motor car;
 - (b) every other member of the Elections Commission, the actual travelling expenses incurred by him for travel by road for the purpose of performing his official duties.
- (3) The holder of any office referred to in paragraph (1) shall, in connection with the performance of his official duties, be entitled to travel at the expense of the Government by transport services operated by the Transport and Harbours Department.
- (4) Every member of the Elections Commission or of a Service Commission shall, in connection with the performance of his official duties as such member, be entitled to be paid the actual travelling expenses incurred by him where he is obliged to travel by other means of transport by reason of the fact that the area from which he is required to travel for the purpose of performing his official duties is not served by road services, or by transport services operated by the Transport and Harbours Department.".

4. Clause 7(1) of the Principal Order is hereby amended by the substitution of the word "twenty" for the word "ten".

5. Clause 9 of the Principal Order is hereby amended in the following respects —

- (a) by renumbering the clause as clause 9(1);
- (b) by the substitution of the word "twenty-five" for the word "twelve"; and
- (c) by the addition of the following paragraph as paragraph
 (2) thereof
 - "(2) Every member of a Service Commission shall be paid a telephone allowance of twenty dollars per month.".
