ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE AMERINDIAN ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 58).

UNDER SECTION 3 OF THE AMERINDIAN ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Amerindian Village Order, 1964.
2. The portion of the Colony described in the schedule hereto is hereby declared to be an Amerindian Village.

SCHEDULE

Karasabai Amerindian Village.

A tract of Crown land situate on the left bank of the Ireng or Maho River, commencing at a point about one mile below the mouth of the Jauri River and its boundaries, extending thence due east for about 7 miles to the western brow of the Pakaraima Mountains, thence about $10\frac{1}{2}$ miles in a north-westerly direction along the said brow of the Pakaraima Mountains to a point about 3 miles south-east of a point about $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles up the left bank of the Karabaikuru Creek, thence due west for about 13 miles to the left bank Ireng River at Kamibaru Point which is about $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles below the mouth of Karabaikuru Creek; thence downwards along the left bank of the Ireng River back to the point of commencement, and containing an area of approximately 80 square miles.
