ORDER IN COUNCIL UNDER SECTION 3 OF THE FOOD PRICES REGULATION ORDINANCE, 1934 (No. 1 OF 1934) REVOKING ORDERS PRESCRIBING THE MAXIMUM PRICES AT WHICH CERTAIN ARTICLES OF FOOD AND FUEL SHALL BE SOLD IN THIS COLONY.

Whereas, it is enacted by section 3 of the Food Prices Regulation Ordinance, 1934, that the Governor in Council may, if he considers it necessary to prevent any undue increase in the prices of food or in any article used as fuel, by Order prescribe the maximum price at which any articles of food or used as fuel may be sold in any district either by wholesale or by retail, and may alter or revoke an Order by a subsequent Order;

And whereas the Food Prices Regulation Order—1934, was made and published on the 18th January, 1934, prescribing the maximum prices at which certain articles of food and fuel shall be sold;

And whereas the Food Prices Regulation Order, (No. 2), 1934, was made on the 26th January, 1934, and published on 27th January, 1934, altering the aforesaid Order;

And whereas it appears no longer desirable to prescribe the maximum prices at which any articles of food or used as fuel may be sold:

Now, therefore, the Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that:—

- I. This Order may be cited as the Food Prices Regulation (Revocation) Order, 1934;
- II. The Food Prices Regulation Order—1934 and the Food Prices Regulation Order (No. 2)—1934, are hereby revoked.
