**UNDER SECTION 12 (8) OF THE IMMIGRATION ACT, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY  
THE PRESIDENT AS FOLLOWS:**

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as the Immigration (Free Movement of Persons) Order 2011.

Amendment of  
the Schedule to  
the Act.

2. The Schedule to the Act is revoked and the following Schedule substituted for the Schedule -

**"SCHEDULE**

**PART A**

- (a) university graduates;
- (b) media workers;
- (c) musicians;
- (d) artistes;
- (e) sports persons;
- (f) teachers;
- (g) registered nurses;
- (h) persons holding associate degrees;
- (i) artisans possessing a Caribbean vocational qualification or an approved National vocational qualification;
- (j) domestics who have obtained a Caribbean vocational qualification.

**PART B**

1. Antigua and Barbuda
2. The Bahamas
3. Barbados
4. Belize
5. Dominica
6. Grenada
7. Jamaica
8. Montserrat
9. Saint Christopher and Nevis
10. Saint Lucia
11. St. Vincent and the Grenadines
12. Suriname
13. Trinidad and Tobago.

Free entry of  
persons in Part A  
of this Schedule.

A person mentioned in Part A of this Schedule who is a national of a country mentioned in Part B of this Schedule shall be permitted by an immigration officer to enter and remain in Guyana either for a definite or an indefinite period subject to the following conditions -

- (a) he must satisfy the requirement specified in the Immigration (Alternative to Passports) Order 1992 in relation to the production of his driver's licence or his identification card; or produce his passport to the immigration officer;
- (b) he must produce evidence satisfactory to the immigration officer that -
  - (i) he is qualified to be included in the list of persons in Part A of this Schedule;
  - (ii) he is a national of a country mentioned in Part B of this Schedule, and
- (c) he must inform the immigration officer of his intention to seek employment or to settle in Guyana."
