IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED
UPON ME BY SECTION 134 OF THE
MINING ACT, 1989, I HEREBY MAKE
THE FOLLOWING ORDER:-

Citation and Commencement.

1. This Order may be cited as the Quarry Licence (Exemption) Order, 2010, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 23rd day of April, 2010.

Exemption and substitution.

2. B.K. Quarries Incorporated shall be exempted from the application of procedural provisions of the Mining Regulations in relation to an application for and grant of Quarry Licence in the area as described in the schedule below which was held by the said B.K. Quarries Incorporated (formerly Linden Quarries Incorporated) under Mining Permit L-3/MP/001 as relinquished on the aforesaid date.


SCHEDULE

DESCRIPTION

A tract of state land located in the Mazaruni Mining District No. 3 on the RB Mazaruni River as shown on Terra Survey topographic sheet 27NE at scale 1:50,000 within the following boundaries:

From point of commencement A Mazaruni River located with geographical coordinates of latitude 6°23'19"N, longitude 58°40'00"W thence at a bearing of 125° for a distance of approximately 1512 yards to point B, located with geographical coordinates of latitude 6°27'05"N, longitude 58°39'23"W thence at a bearing of 216° for a distance of approximately 1 mile 1458 yards crossing Barakara & Tumareng River & and Old Trail to point C, located with geographical coordinates of latitude 6°21'49"N, longitude 58°40'20"W thence at a bearing of 305° for a distance of approximately 1 mile 110 yards to point D, Mazaruni River located with geographical coordinates of latitude 6°22'07"N, longitude 58°41'07"W thence down R B Mazaruni River for a distance of approximately 2 miles 165 yards to point A, being the point of commencement, thus enclosing an area of approximately 1200 acres, save and except all lands lawfully held or occupied.
