**BOUNDARIES OF BARTICA VILLAGE DISTRICT**

Being all that area situate in the County of Essequibo and bounded as follows —

| On the North | By the Mazaruni River.   |
| On the South | By the prolongation westwards of the upper boundary of Grant No. 4572 at Dog Point, to the right bank of Koetaru Creek, thence to a point on the left bank, thence up the left bank of the (said) Koetaru Creek to the South East <b>corner of Lot 136</b> on the East side of Bartica-Potaro Road, thence along the prolongation southwards of the common back boundaries of the lots along the East side of the Bartica-Potaro Road to the northern boundary of Grant 423, thence westwards along the Bartica Potaro Road, thence Southwards along the Bartica-Potaro Road to the 5 mile pole Bartica-Potaro Road. |
| On the East  | By the Essequibo River.  |
| On the West  | By a line from the 5th Mile Pole, Bartica-Potaro Road, 6000 feet in a north westerly direction to the left bank of the Barakara Creek, thence across the Barakara Creek to a point on the opposite bank, thence down the right bank of the Barakara Creek to the Mazaruni River.   |
