IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON THE MINISTER BY SECTIONS 2 AND 4 OF THE PLANT PROTECTION ACT, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Plant Diseases (Coconut Citation. Trees) (Cedros Wilt) Order 1986.
 - In this Order —

Interpreta-

- (a) "coconut planting material" means the coconut palm and includs unshelled nuts, seedlings and such other parts of the coconut palm, or the soil of the plant, but does not include shelled nuts, dried copra, processed fibre and other manufactured products of the coconut;
- (b) "specified areas" means the areas specified in the Schedule.

Declaration

- 3. Owing to the presence of the disease related to coconic trees, known as Cedres Wilt in the specified areas, the undergood Wilt is hereby declared to be a disease within the meaning of the Act.
- kestriction 4. (1) No person shall transport any coconut planting of transport material from the specified areas except under and in account planting dance with an authority issued by the Chief Agricultural Office material.
 - (2) The Chief Agricultural Officer recy is to a chief the freinsport of any coconut planning n aterial from the specified areas if he is satisfied that the coconut planning material is not diseased or appearing to be affected with the disease or likely to infect any plant with the disease.
- Restriction 5.(1) No person shall undertake any cultivation and har of cultivation vesting in the specified areas, of the coconut palm, unless prior tag of permission of the Chief Agricultural Officer is tained therefor palm.
 - such permission, have due regard to the measures that are necessary for the control or eradication of the disease.
 - 6. (1) The Chief Agricultural Officer is hereby directed.

- (a) to take such precautions as are necessary to prevent the spread of the disease; and
- (b) to carry out the disinfection or treatment of any coconut planting material likely to infest or infect any coconut palm with the disease.
- (2) The Chief Agricultural Officer is hereby authorised to take steps for the immediate destriction without compensation of any plant or article which on inspection appears to be infested or infected with the disease.
