

## ORDER IN COUNCIL

MADE UNDER

THE ANIMAL DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936,  
(No. 29 of 1936).

UNDER SECTIONS 2 AND 13 OF THE ANIMAL DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936, AS AMENDED BY SECTION 2 OF THE ANIMAL DISEASES (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1953, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Animal Diseases (Prohibition of Importation) (No. 2) Order, 1953.

2. In this Order —

“fodder” means fodder of any kind brought with any animal;

“litter” means any straw, hay and any other substance used as bedding for any animal and includes excreta of such animal.

3. The definition of the expression “animal” in section 2 of the Animal Diseases Ordinance, 1936\*, is hereby extended for the purposes of this Order to include cats.

4. On and after the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, animals or the carcasses thereof, or any fodder or litter thereof shall not be brought from Grenada, British West Indies, into the Colony.
