ORDER IN COUNCIL

MADE UNDER

THE MAINTENANCE ORDERS (FACILITIES FOR ENFORCEMENT ORDINANCE, (Chapter 146).

WHEREAS by the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement Ordinance, provision has been made for the enforcement in this Colonv of maintenance orders made by any Court in England or Ireland;

AND WHEREAS it is provided in subsection (1) of section twelve of the said Ordinance that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provision have been made by the legislature of any part of Her Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of Her Majesty's dominions of maintenance orders made by Courts within this Colony, the Governor may by Order in Council declare that the said Ordinance shall extend to maintenance orders made by Courts in that part of Her Majesty's dominions in like manner as it extends to maintenance orders made within England and Ireland, and on that order being made the said Ordinance shall extend accordingly;

AND WHEREAS the Governor is satisfied that the Legislature of the States of Guernsey being part of Her Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom has made reciprocal provisions for the enforcements within that part of maintenance orders made by the Courts within this Colony:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Governor by virtue and in the exercise of the powers vested in him by the abovementioned Ordinance, is pleased by and with advice of His Executive Council to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared as follow—

The Maintenance Orders (Facilities For Enforcement) Ordinance shall extend to maintenance Orders made by Courts within the States of Guernsey in like manner as it extends to maintenance orders made within England and Ireland.
