THE SUMMARY JURISDICTION (MAGISTRATES) ORDINANCE, (Chapter 12).

UNDER SECTION 3 OF THE SUMMÁRY JURISDICTION (MAGIS-TRATES) ORDINANCE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Courantyne and Berbice Judicial Districts (Boundaries) Order, 1956.
2. The limits of the Courantyne Judicial District and Berbice Judicial

2. The limits of the Courantyne Judicial District and Berbice Judicial District into which the County of Berbice is divided are hereby varied and shall, as from the commencement of this Order, be as defined in the schedule hereto.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 12th day of March, 1956.

4. The Order in Council made on the 13th March, 1951, and numbered 9, in so far as it relates to the Courantyne and Berbice Judicial Districts, is hereby revoked.

THE COURANTYNE JUDICIAL DISTRICT.

SCHEDULE

I.

2,

That part of the Colony bounded as follows—

on the north by the Atlantic Ocean;

on the east by the Courantyne River as far south as the 4th parallel of north latitude;

on the south by the 4th parallel of north latitude;

on the west by the watershed between the Courantyne and Berbice Rivers from the 4th parallell of north latitude to the source of the Canje River; thence by the Canje River to the "Old Port Mourant Water Path"; thence by the Old Port Mourant Water Path to the western boundary of Plantation Port Mourant; thence along the western boundary of Plantation Port Mourant to the Atlantic Ocean.

THE BERBICE JUDICIAL DISTRICT.

That part of the Colonv bounded as follows-

on the north by the Atlantic Occan;

- on the east by the Eastern boundary of Plantation Rose Hall on the Courantyne Coast to the back boundary, thence along the Old Port Mourant Water Path to the Canje River, thence along the Canje River to its source; thence by the watershed, between the Berbice and Courantyne Rivers to the 4th parallel of north latitude;
- on the south by the 4th parallel of north latitude from the point of intersection with the castern boundary to the point of intersection with the watershed between the Berbice and Essequibo Rivers;
- On the west by the watershed between the Berbice and Essequibo Rivers to the source of the Demerara River; thence by the watershed of the tributarics on the right bank of the Demerara River to the source of the Warababuru Creek; thence by the Warababuru Creek to its junction with the Ituni River; thence by the Ituni River to its source; thence by the watershed of the tributaries on the right bank of the Demerara River to a point due west of the source of the Abary River; thence by an imaginary straight line to the source of the Abary River; thence by the Abary River to the Atlantic Ocean.
