ORDER IN COUNCIL

Made Under

THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 132)

UNDER SECTIONS 16(2) AND 17 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE THE FOLLOWING ORDER HAS BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

1. The first schedule to Order in Council No. 47 made on the 27th of December, 1950, as substituted by Order in Council No. 19 made on the 22nd of May, 1951, which prescribes the rates of postage and fees for services under the Post and Telegraph Ordinance* is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

2. The second schedule to the Order in Council first referred to in article 1 of this Order is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

“SECOND SCHEDULE

Service	Fee
1. Insurance fee (additional to postage).	10 cents for each £12 or part thereof insured value (£60 maximum insured value).
2. Express delivery fee (inclusive of registration fee but exclusive of postage).	18 cents.
3. Registration fee.	12 cents.
4. Advice of delivery or enquiry fee (registered and insured letters).	12 cents.

3. This Order shall come into force on the 15th day of November, 1956.
