ORDER IN COUNCIL

Made Under

THE ANIMALS DISEASES ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 258).

UNDER SECTION 15 OF THE ANIMALS DISEASES ORDINANCE, IT IS
HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Animals Diseases (Anthrax No. 2) Order, 1956.
2. In this Order—
 - “fodder” means any hay, grass, oats, barley, mash or grain of any kind;
 - “litter” means any straw, grass and any other substance used as bedding for any animal, and includes excreta of such animal;
 - “the Ordinance” means the Animals Diseases Ordinance (Chapter 258).
3. The definition of the expression “animal” in section 2 of the Ordinance is hereby extended for the purposes of this Order to include cats and all feathered stock.
4. Owing to the presence therein of cases of anthrax, the area described in the schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as “the area”) is hereby declared to be, for the purpose of the Ordinance, an area infected with anthrax.
5. No person shall, except with the written permission of an officer, remove any carcass of any animal or part thereof, or any fodder or litter from the area.

SCHEDULE

That area known as and called Mackenzie situate on the right bank of the Demerara River.
