ORDER IN COUNCIL Made Under THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE (Chapter 309).

UNDER SECTION 8 OF THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:—

Part III of the first schedule to the Customs Ordinance, as amended from time to time, is hereby further amended —

- (a) by the deletion of sub-item (9) of item 27; and
- (b) by the deletion of item 11 and the substitution therefor of the following —

"11. Ingredients used in the manufacture of —

(1) spirituous compounds manufactured in bonded premises; and

(2) beer manufactured in a licensed brewery:—

Provided that these exemptions shall not apply to ingredients classified as alcholic beverages in group 112 of the Trade Classification List and Tariff set out in Part I of this schedule."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

Materials from Scheduled Territories imported for use in the manufacture of beer are now exempt from customs duty. This order replaces this exemption by a general exemption of all ingredients, from whatever source, imported for use in the manufacture of beer.
