BRITISH GUIANA

ORDER IN COUNCIL

Made Under

THE FACTORIES ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 115).

IN PURSUANCE OF THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 2 OF THE FACTORIES ORDINANCE, AND OF ALL OTHER POWERS HIM THEREUNTO ENABLING, THE FOLLOWING ORDER HAS BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

The following is hereby inserted as item 13 of the schedule to the aforementioned Ordinance —

“13. Any premises used as a quarry, that is to say, any open work, pit or excavation from which stone or rock is obtained by way of cutting, blasting or other methods, but not any place where any manufacturing process, other than a process ancillary to the getting, dressing or preparation for sale of stone or rock, is carried on”.
