'THE CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICES (REMUNERATION OF HOLDERS)
ACT

(Cap. 27:11)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON ME BY SECTION
5 OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICES (REMUNERATION OF
HOLDERS) ACT, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

1.(1) This Order may be cited as the Constitutional Offices (Remuneration of Holders) Order 1981. Citation and commencement.

(2) Clause 2(a) of this order shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st January, 1981.

(3) Clause 2(b) of this order shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st June, 1981.

2. The Schedule to the Act is hereby amended as follows — Amendment of the Schedule to the Act.

- (a) by the substitution of the following particulars in relation to the office-holders specified hereunder for the corresponding particulars therein in relation to the said office-holders —

“Judges of the Supreme Court of Judicature —

(a) The Chancellor — salary	\$57,600
(b) The Chief Justice — salary	\$52,800
(c) Every Justice of Appeal — salary	\$48,000
(d) Every Puisne Judge — salary	\$42,000
The Ombudsman — salary	\$48,000
The Director of Public Prosecutions — salary	\$48,000
The Auditor General — salary	\$52,000

(b) by the addition of the following particulars —

“The Chairman of the Teaching Service Commission — salary ...	\$15,000
The Deputy Chairman of the Teaching Service Commission — salary	\$ 9,000
Every appointed member of the Teaching Service Commission, other than the Chairman and the Deputy Chairman, performing full-time duties with the Commission — salary	\$9,000
Every other appointed member of the Teaching Service Commission — salary	\$6,000.”
