THE CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICES (REMUNERATION OF HOLDERS) ACT

(Cap. 27:11)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON ME BY SECTION 3 OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICES (REMUNERATION OF HOLDERS) ACT, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

1.(1) This Order, which amends the Constitutional Offices (Holders' Allowances) Order\*, may be cited as the Constitutional Offices (Holders' Allowances) (Amendment) (No. 3) Order 1981. Citation and commencement.

(2) This order, except clause 3, shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st January, 1981.

(3) Clause 3 of this order shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st June, 1981.

2. Clause 4 of the Principal Order is hereby amended — Amendment of clause 4 of the Principal Order.

(a) by substituting the words "8,400", "\$7,200" and "\$6,000" for the words "\$6,000", "\$4,800" and "\$3,900" respectively; and

(b) by substituting for the words "Every Puisne Judge and the Auditor General .....\$3,300 per annum" the following —

"Every Puisne Judge	\$4,800 per annum ✓
The Auditor	
General	... \$7,200 per annum." .

3. Clause 6 of the Principal Order is hereby amended by the addition of the following paragraph after paragraph (4) — **Amendment of clause 6 of the Principal Order.**

“(5) (a) In respect of the use of his motor car on official duty there shall be paid to —

- (i) every appointed member of the Teaching Service Commission performing full-time duties with the Commission, a travelling allowance at the Scale C rate;
- (ii) every other appointed member of the Teaching Service Commission, a travelling allowance at the Scale B rate, the rates referred to herein being those payable to public officers and subject to the conditions of payment from time to time applying to those officers.

(b) Where any appointed member of the Teaching Service Commission does not own a motor car, there shall be paid to him, subject to a maximum of one hundred and five dollars per month, the actual travelling expenses incurred by him for the purpose of performing his official duties.”.

4. Clause 7(1) of the Principal Order is hereby amended by the substitution of the word “fifty” for the word “twenty”. **Amendment of clause 7 of the Principal Order.**

5. Clause 8 of the Principal Order is hereby amended by the substitution therefor of the following clause — **Amendment of clause 8 of the Principal Order.**

“Entertainment allowance.

8. The persons holding the respective offices specified hereunder shall be paid entertainment allowances at the rates specified hereunder in respect of those offices —

The Chancellor	\$500 per month
The Chief Justice, every Justice of Appeal, the Ombudsman and the Director of Public Prosecutions	... \$400 per month
Every Puisne Judge	... \$300 per month
The Auditor General	... \$500 per month.

6. Clause 10 of the Principal Order is hereby amended by the substitution therefor of the following clause —

**"House  
allowance.**

10. In respect of any period for which he is not provided by the Government with a furnished residence, a house allowance shall be paid —

- (a) to the Chancellor at the rate of six hundred dollars per month;
- (b) to the Chief Justice, every Justice of Appeal, the Ombudsman and the Director of Public Prosecution at the rate of five hundred dollars per month;
- (c) to every Puisne Judge at the rate of four hundred dollars per month;
- (d) to the Auditor General at the rate of five hundred dollars per month."
